Framework for Analysis

- Recap the Sixth Power Plan analysis, resource strategy and action plan
- Scan the overall situation and prepare narratives describing developments since the Sixth Power Plan
- Identify and analyze major topics for the Mid-Term Assessment
- Report on progress of existing regional efforts
- Update key forecasts and assumptions
- Evaluate the Sixth Power Plan's resource strategy and action plan in light of recent developments and updated forecasts
- Develop conclusions and recommendations for Council consideration
- 'Tee up' topics for the Seventh Power Plan



Progress Since July Meeting

- Issued fuel price forecasts July 20
- Updated estimates of power imports available to meet regional needs, and impacts on resource adequacy
- Working on power price forecast
- Compiling responses to survey of conservation achievements
- Prepared materials on conservation cost-effectiveness
- Drafted situation scan narratives
- Received input from PNUCC on topics for Seventh Power Plan



Topics for the Seventh Power Plan Input from PNUCC

- Process: communicate key messages, technical details
- Policy: identify and discuss policies that drive the plan
- Topics for Analysis:
 - > State and federal climate change policies
 - Renewable portfolio standards
 - Assess capacity and flexible capacity needs
 - ➤ Transmission
 - ➢ Use of natural gas for electric generation
 - Reliance on power imports from other regions
 - Identify regional need for power resources
 - Demand forecast, including intra-hourly shape, peak loads
 - Conservation cost-effectiveness from regional and utility perspectives
 - Factors affecting resource acquisition decisions linkage between Council and utility plans
 - Coal plant retirements



Updated Schedule

- August: situation scan and narratives; conservation costeffectiveness; transmission issues
- September: wholesale power price forecast; conservation achievements; resource adequacy; Sixth Power Plan recap
- October: major topics; regional efforts; resource strategy evaluation
- November: conclusions and recommendations; topics for Seventh Power Plan; draft report
